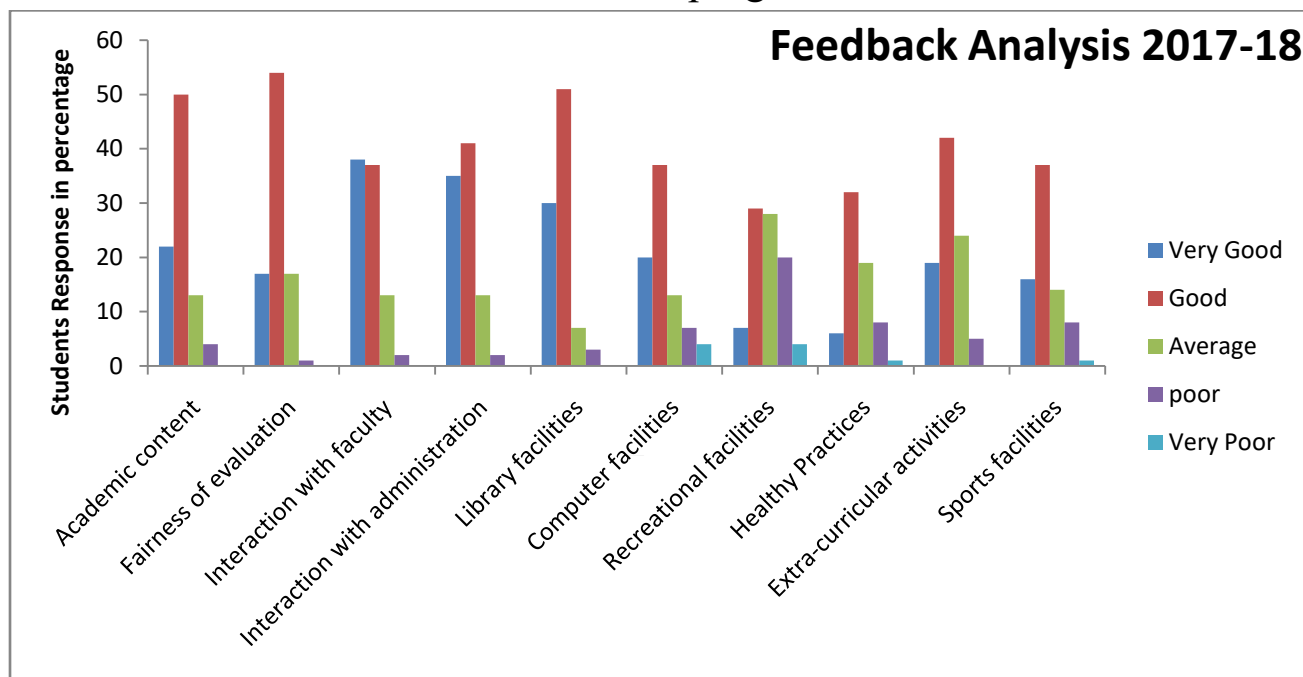

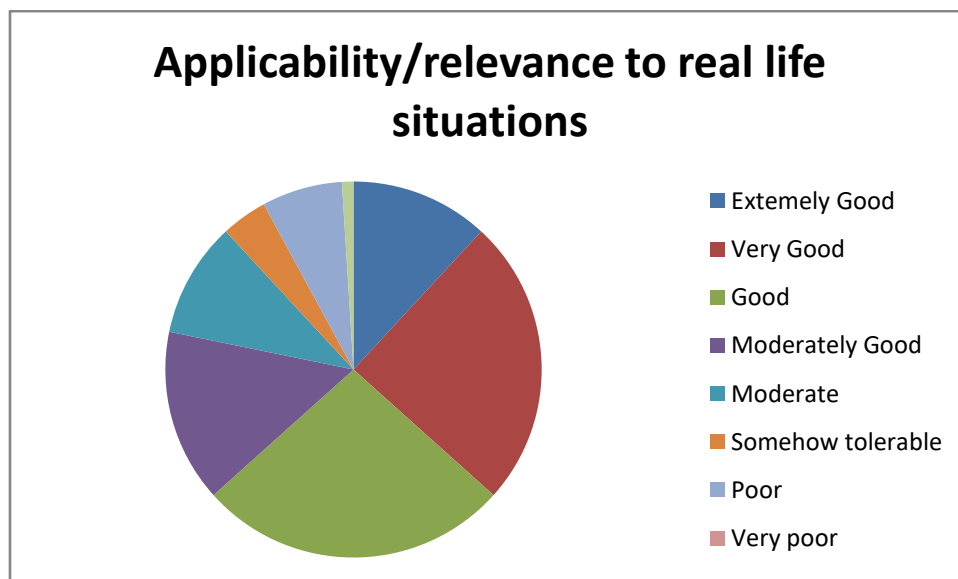
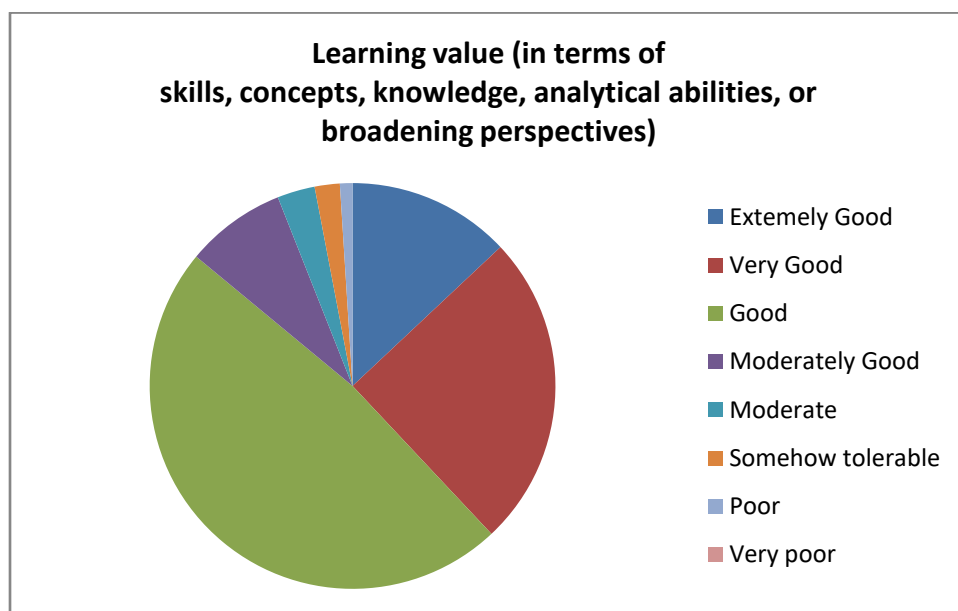
Response of students in percentage versus important points related to course program



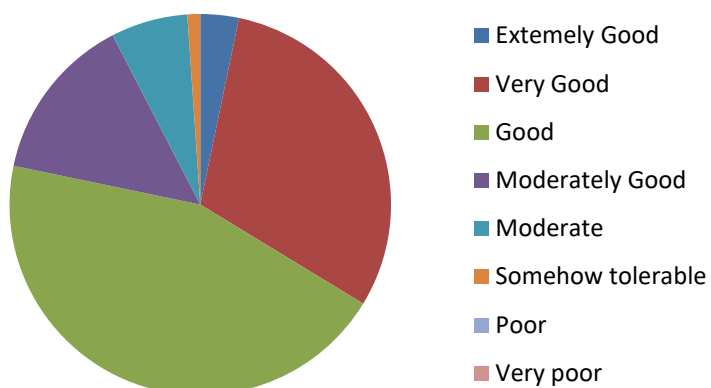

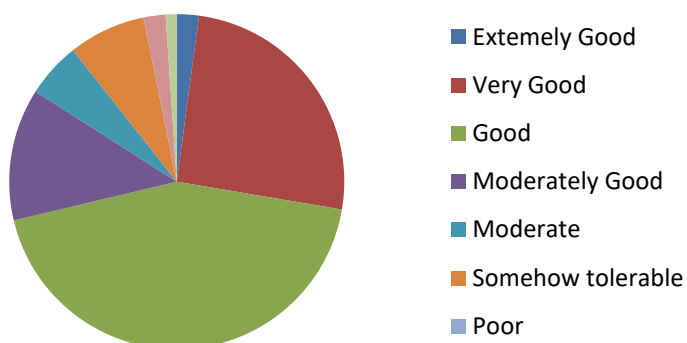
Response of students in percentage versus important points related to Syllabus



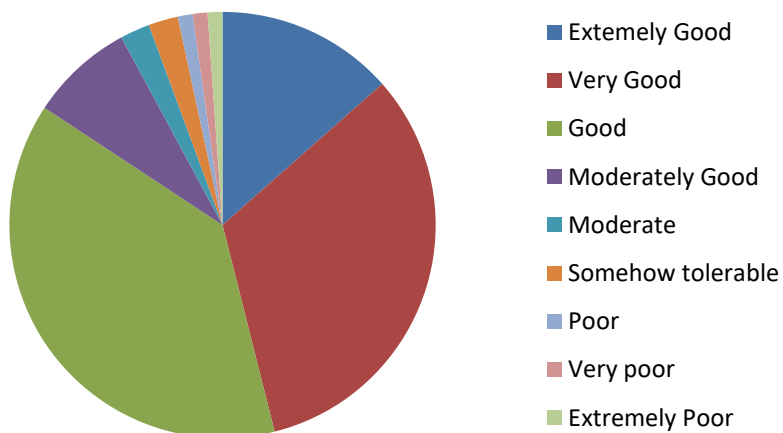
Depth of the course content



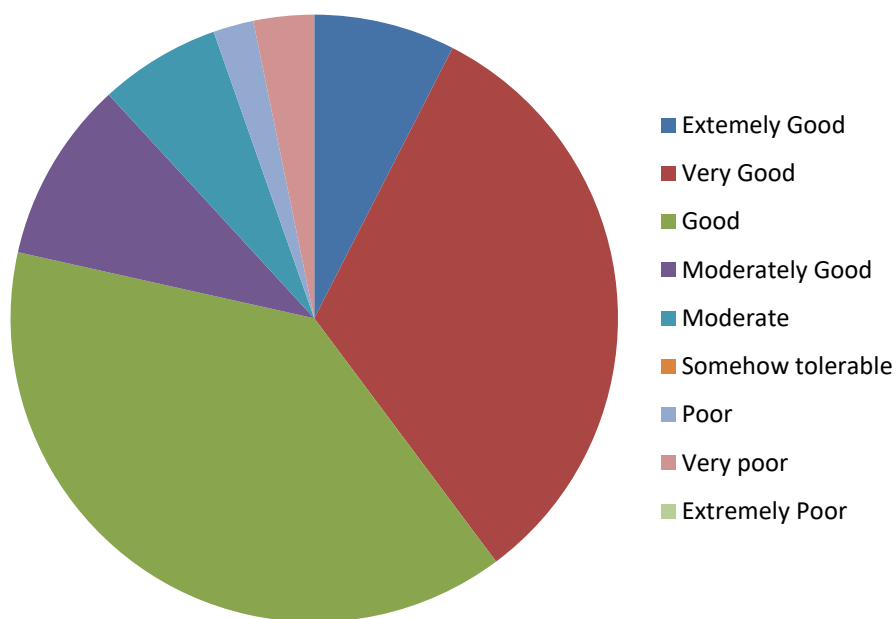
Extent of coverage of course
